What is an REI Service Project?

These projects are a local expression of REI's commitment to conservation that is focused on outdoor recreational opportunities. This presents a positive image-building activity for REI that is in keeping with the membership involvement of our co-operative business.



Why does REI do Service Projects?

- ➤ To educate volunteers and community members about recreational opportunities unique to their community.
- To provide participation activities for REI members.
- To give back to the community as a corporate citizen.
- To display REI's commitment to protecting and enhancing recreational opportunities.

What are we doing this year?

We will be assisting the Arastradero Preserve Stewardship Project of Acterra, City of Palo Alto, Open Space and Science Division and the Trail Center. This year we have two projects for you to choose from! The first is a Trail Improvement project that entails widening and level the Acorn Trail connector and close up a parallel trail. The second choice is Habitat Restoration that entails planting acorns in tree tubes and removal of non-native plants in the park. This is a great opportunity to be involved with REI employees and community members in helping the environment and recreational opportunities in our community.

Why Arastradero Preserve Stewardship?

APSPA is dedicated to preserving and restoring the peninsula's parks and open space so the public can continually enjoy the wilderness the way it should be. APSPA's staff and volunteers provide a much-needed source of labor to repair and enhance existing trails, construct new narrow trails, and lead the effort in habitat restoration. In turn, the public learns concepts of land stewardship and resource conservation while giving back to the trails systems and parks they enjoy.

- Minimum age is 16 years old on the trail and no age limit on the restoration project.

What to bring?

- ➤ Food snacks and water. There will be water a station set up along the trail. We recommend you bring water in case the 20 gallons that will be on hand does not last.
- **Rainwear** everyone should have rain gear just in case.
